Started in 1988, New Jersey's School-based Youth Services Program (SBYSP) is the first state-wide initiative to place comprehensive health and social services in or near schools. The SBYSP currently operates in more than 60 urban, rural, and suburban school districts throughout New Jersey. Each site provides counseling, employment preparation, recreation, and health services. Funded by the New Jersey Department of Human Services, the SBYSP seeks to help young people stay emotionally and physically healthy so they are more likely to stay in school, graduate and ultimately become productive, responsible community members.

PATHWAYS is open before, during, and after school, including two evenings per week until 8:00 p.m. Special programming is also scheduled on designated weekends, and a full summer program is available. Most services are free of charge and open to all Carteret High School students and their families.
